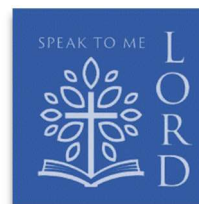

PPC - PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

Each parish of the Archdiocese has a Parish Pastoral Council - a group of people interested in promoting the mission of the parish with the clergy appointed by the Archbishop. In recent times we are asked to partnership with other parishes nearby following on from the Synodal and Building Hope plan of the Diocese. In St. Colmcille's we have just had a change of leadership in our Council due to the fact that members have to change after a certain number of years. At the moment Andrias O'Caoimh has accepted this task after Michael O' Brien completed his term of office as Chair. Some members will remain for the rest of the year to facilitate the changes. We thank Michael and all members who have served the parish in this way in recent years.

In the church notice boards we have the full names of the members noted there for your information.

The Council meets monthly at the Iona Pastoral Centre except for July and August, unless in some other need. Minutes and agenda are filed for these meetings so that decisions made can be followed up and a written history is kept. The Council has a total of eight and fifteen members of elected and exofficio members. Some can be appointed because of their expertise in certain areas to a maximum of three.

The work of the council is under the priest or Administrator appointed by the Archbishop and with the Chair, Vice Chair and Secretary, guide the council in deliberations at regular meetings.

As a parish within the Dublin South Deanery we commit ourselves to working with other parishes along with the area Bishop Vicar and Vicar Forane. For those interested the Pastoral Guidelines are available and regular information is given to the parish through the Knocklyon News and other media outlets.

As the Administrator with Fr. Cyril and Deacon Michael we thank all those who have served on the Council during the Covid years and wish the new Council much success in the coming years.

Please be informed of who the members of the Council are and pray for them in their work for the Parish.

If you have any concern you made address this to any member of the Council who will bring it forward to the meetings.
